“Dot Leigh”

During her last weekend working at The 58<sup>th</sup> Annual St. Petersburg Women’s Classic tournament, I spoke with Dot. She has got to be the kindest person I have met. She is always talking about her past, helping whenever and wherever she can. She would stop by the office and pick up Classic entries to hand out at the women’s tournament or wherever she went with her shirts to sell. It’s amazing at her age that she can lug that trailer all around the state of Florida.

Anyways, I spoke to her the last Sunday of the tournament. She told me that she has 2 children, 4 grandchildren and 9 great grandchildren. She is moving to Garfield, Arkansas. She is retiring. Moving in with her grandson.

She started bowling in 1941. Her high school teacher used to bring them for fun to Corn’s Alley, which was on 4<sup>th</sup> Street across from Sunken Gardens in St. Petersburg. In order to bowl, they had to bowl and then set the pins and the next person bowled. She said the balls were made of cork.

The kids used to go roller skating and across the street from that was another bowling center Pop Kelly Lanes on 9<sup>th</sup> Street South & 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue in St. Petersburg. This bowling alley (as they called it back then) was only 9 lanes. Bowling with her high school teacher, she began to really like bowling. So when she was at Pop Kelly Lanes a lady by the name of Cari Hirtle approached her and asked her if she would like to join their women’s league. Dot was only 16, but she proudly accepted. She averaged a 116. She bought a new ball & shoes, but shortly after that, the place burned down and she lost her new ball & shoes.

In the late 40's early 50's, Ten Pin Lanes was built; this center is in South Pasadena and is still there to this day. Walt Wachter built this center and it was the biggest center in Florida with 20 lanes. Here again, she bowled in a league.

In 1953, Dot & two of her friends Millie Osborne & Elma Andersen decided to start a Ladies Tournament. Millie was in charge of advertising and got Derby Lanes to sponsor the tournament. Eleanor helped out, and Dot was the secretary. They started with a Team Event and a Singles Event. Their first year, they had 30 – 40 teams. Dot said that they would go to Nationals and hand out entry forms, every where they could hand them out, they did so. Also they had a side doubles tournament going on and that was for the husbands who came to watch ladies bowl. This gave them something to do.

In the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the Derby Lanes Classic, they had to change the name of the tournament because Derby Lanes allowed gambling. So they changed the name to The St. Petersburg Classic. About 6 years into the tournament they had 300 teams from all over to bowl in the tournament. Bowlers came from all over the United States.

In the early 50's she was put on the State Board. In 1958 she started The Ladies State Tournament. She did everything by hand, they had no computers. She would travel to the centers and check the centers out before deciding which center she would choose for the Tournament. She would be paid \$1 per team. She did this until 1974.

In 1974 she went to work at Sunshine Bowl where she ran the Pro Shop. When Seminole Lanes opened they had 40 lanes, Dot built their pro shop and continued to run the pro shop at Sunshine Bowl as well. She also used to teach bowling.

In 1980, Dot and a friend started screen printing, knitting and sewing for the bowlers. Then in 1998 she started selling shirts from her car. When she got her Social Security the first year, they gave her a lump sum and she used that to buy her trailer.

Since 1998 she has traveled all over the State of Florida selling her t-shirts at different tournaments. She said the ladies have always liked her shirts.

Here it is 2011 and she is still going. As I said before, she amazes me. She spent 3 weekends on her feet most of the time, selling, working, and talking to people at The St. Petersburg Classic Tournament.

I hope she enjoys her retirement and we at Gulf Coast USBC and I am sure everyone that has had the opportunity to meet Dot, wishes her a happy retirement with her grandson and his family.

(i.e. hambone is now considered the term for 4 consecutive strikes) Here are a few that were new to me: Apple- a bowling ball, or one who doesn't come through in a clutch situation. Balsa- a slight, powerless hit on the headpin. Benchwork- Any type of conversation or actions intended to upset an opponent. Buzzard- 3 open frames in a row. Cincinnati- an 8-10 split, and Pindicator- a lighted display board showing which pins are left standing. So, the next time you use "bowling" words in the front of new bowlers, you may want to let them know what each means so that they can feel that they are a part of the bowling fraternity too.

The Florida 500 Club held its 21<sup>st</sup> annual Tournament and Meeting Oct. 21-23 in New Port Richey, hosted by the Suncoast 500 Club. Arlene Oates of Hudson won the Singles Championship with a handicap 722, taking home a nice check for \$250. Other top winners were (2) Margaret M. Denk of New Port Richey, 686; (3 & 4 tie) Vilma Jimenez –Silva of Cape Coral, 684, and Janie Burdick of Deland, 684; and (5) Betty Betz of New Port Richey, 677. Low to cash was a 617.

The Doubles Champions are Kim Martin and Mary Smith-Milano of Auburndale, 1319. Finishing out the top five were (2) Cathleen R. Cavanagh and Jennifer Cavanagh of Spring Hill, 1313; (3) Theresa Walsh and Barbara Horton of Sebring, 1309 tied with (3) Nancy Miller and Ann Waters of Auburndale, 1309; and (5) Maxine Andrews and June Miller of Edgewater, 1304.

Mary Service of Boca Raton was the All Events winner with a 1,362, followed by (2) Carol Hibbens of North Port with a 1317; (3) Laura Moss of Edgewater, 1313, tied with (3) Martha Schuldiner of The Villages, 1313; and (5) Grace Chadbourne of Melbourne, 1305. It just shows how every pin is important in tournament competition!

For the first time this year, the opening ceremonies were scheduled so that everyone who wanted to could attend and still get to the Singles house for their squad. Opening ceremonies are always scheduled for the Doubles house, but if you missed it this year, you missed an awesome display of patriotism. An honor guard from McDill AFB presented the flag followed by the National Anthem. Then “I’m Proud to Be an American” by Lee Greenwood was played over the intercom. Without ANY prompting, EVERYONE stood up, joined hands in three long lines throughout the bowling center, and sang along. Just about everyone was in tears when it was over. It was a beautiful display of the American spirit.

On Friday evening, Florida 500 Club President Liz Waldren from Deland welcomed over 100 state members to the annual membership meeting at the Quality Inn, New Port Richey, the host hotel. The Friday meeting is the club’s one opportunity to discuss club business, elect officers and share committee reports. Secretary Donna Oberg reported the club had welcomed 82 new members last year, bringing the total membership to 4,534.

Directors re-elected for three years terms were Sharon Cogburn of Deltona; Linda Myers and Mary Lynne Helfrich of Winter Haven; Marty Schuldiner of The Villages; and Helen Newton of Ormond Beach.

For the first time in the club's history, two members were inducted in the Florida 500 Club's Hall of Fame. In announcing the names, Hall of Fame Chairman Linda Angley told the members the nominees were so outstanding they couldn't decide on just one, so they named them both. Selected were Diana Eichlin of Eagle Lake, secretary of the Polk County 500 Club for the past 21 years and a former state director and newsletter editor, and Helen Newton of Daytona Beach, a Florida 500 Club director for the past 8 years. Helen also is president of the Daytona Beach Women's Association and was honored by her association as its Hall of Fame recipient just a week or so before the state tournament. Congratulations to these ladies who have devoted countless hours to their local and state organizations in promoting their love of bowling.

No formal bids were received for the 2013 tournament, but two locations are considering it. Next year Daytona Beach will host the tournament on Oct. 26-28, 2012, the week AFTER Biketober Fest! Keep these dates open for next year! Entry forms will be in the mail to state members in May.

Local 500 Club presidents and secretaries are encouraged to contact Secretary Donna O'berg when new club officers are elected so that the state can keep in contact with these local officials.

Many local clubs also host invitational tournaments throughout the year. Upcoming tournaments include: Phoenix 500 Club, Sebring, Dec. 18; Polk County 500 Club, Jan. 29; Highlands County 500 Club, Feb. 19; Ocala 500 Club, March 24; and Suncoast 500 Club, April 29.
